THEIR WORK OFTEN SERVED AS A CATALYST FOR PUBLIC OUTRAGE AND DEMAND FOR GOVERNMENT INTERVENTION.

PROGRESSIVE PRESIDENTS: ROOSEVELT, TAFT, AND WILSON

THEY USED THEIR OFFICE TO ADVOCATE FOR REFORM, REGULATE BUSINESS, AND MEDIATE SOCIAL CONFLICTS. THIS MARKED A DEPARTURE FROM EARLIER PRESIDENTS WHO HAD MAINTAINED A MORE LIMITED ROLE IN GOVERNMENT

INTERVENTION. THE CHAPTER LIKELY ANALYZES HOW THESE PRESIDENTS UTILIZED THEIR PLATFORMS AND THE POWERS OF THEIR OFFICE TO ENACT THEIR AGENDAS, THEREBY RESHAPING THE NATURE OF AMERICAN LEADERSHIP.

THE MODERN AMERICAN STATE
