

CONTEXT CLUES WORKSHEET HIGH SCHOOL

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UNDERSTANDING THE POWER OF CONTEXT CLUES FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

THE ABILITY TO INFER THE MEANING OF UNKNOWN WORDS FROM THE SURROUNDING TEXT IS A CRUCIAL SKILL FOR ACADEMIC SUCCESS. CONTEXT CLUES PROVIDE A BRIDGE, ALLOWING READERS TO DECODE MEANING WITHOUT CONSTANTLY REACHING FOR A DICTIONARY, THEREBY MAINTAINING THE FLOW AND ENGAGEMENT WITH THE MATERIAL. THIS PROACTIVE APPROACH TO VOCABULARY ACQUISITION NOT ONLY ENHANCES COMPREHENSION BUT ALSO BUILDS CONFIDENCE AND INDEPENDENCE IN LEARNING. A STRONG GRASP OF CONTEXT CLUES EMPOWERS STUDENTS TO BECOME MORE ADEPT READERS ACROSS ALL SUBJECT AREAS, FROM LITERATURE AND HISTORY TO SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS.

WHEN FACED WITH A WORD THEY DON'T RECOGNIZE, HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS CAN OFTEN LEVERAGE THE INFORMATION PROVIDED BY THE WORDS AND SENTENCES AROUND IT. THIS SURROUNDING INFORMATION, KNOWN AS CONTEXT, OFFERS VALUABLE HINTS OR CLUES TO THE WORD'S MEANING. THESE ARE NOT JUST RANDOM HINTS; THEY ARE DELIBERATE LINGUISTIC TOOLS THAT AUTHORS USE TO GUIDE READERS. LEARNING TO IDENTIFY AND INTERPRET THESE CLUES IS A FUNDAMENTAL ASPECT OF DEVELOPING STRONG READING COMPREHENSION SKILLS, A CORNERSTONE OF EFFECTIVE LEARNING AT THE HIGH SCHOOL LEVEL.

WHY CONTEXT CLUES MATTER IN HIGH SCHOOL ACADEMICS

THE ACADEMIC DEMANDS OF HIGH SCHOOL ARE SIGNIFICANT, REQUIRING STUDENTS TO PROCESS LARGE VOLUMES OF INFORMATION PRESENTED IN VARIOUS TEXTS. A ROBUST VOCABULARY IS UNDENIABLY IMPORTANT, BUT DEVELOPING THE ABILITY TO EXPAND THAT VOCABULARY INDEPENDENTLY IS PARAMOUNT. THIS IS WHERE CONTEXT CLUES BECOME AN INDISPENSABLE TOOL. INSTEAD OF INTERRUPTING THE READING PROCESS TO LOOK UP EVERY UNFAMILIAR WORD, STUDENTS WHO ARE PROFICIENT IN USING CONTEXT CLUES CAN OFTEN INFER THE MEANING OF NEW VOCABULARY ON THEIR OWN. THIS NOT ONLY SPEEDS UP THEIR READING BUT ALSO DEEPENS THEIR UNDERSTANDING OF THE PASSAGE AS A WHOLE.

FURTHERMORE, MASTERING CONTEXT CLUES FOSTERS CRITICAL THINKING. STUDENTS LEARN TO ANALYZE THE RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN WORDS AND IDEAS WITHIN A TEXT, IDENTIFYING PATTERNS AND DRAWING LOGICAL CONCLUSIONS. THIS ANALYTICAL APPROACH EXTENDS BEYOND VOCABULARY BUILDING TO IMPROVING COMPREHENSION IN SUBJECTS THAT RELY HEAVILY ON SPECIALIZED TERMINOLOGY, SUCH AS SCIENCE, SOCIAL STUDIES, AND ADVANCED LITERATURE. A STUDENT WHO CAN DECIPHER THE MEANING OF "MITOCHONDRIA" FROM A BIOLOGY TEXTBOOK'S DESCRIPTION OR "UBIQUITOUS" FROM A HISTORICAL DOCUMENT GAINS A DEEPER AND MORE IMMEDIATE UNDERSTANDING OF THE SUBJECT MATTER.

THE ABILITY TO USE CONTEXT CLUES ALSO PREPARES STUDENTS FOR STANDARDIZED TESTS AND FUTURE ACADEMIC PURSUITS. THESE ASSESSMENTS OFTEN REQUIRE STUDENTS TO UNDERSTAND NUANCED VOCABULARY WITHIN SPECIFIC CONTEXTS. BY DEVELOPING THIS SKILL EARLY IN HIGH SCHOOL, STUDENTS ARE BETTER EQUIPPED TO EXCEL IN THESE HIGH-STAKES SITUATIONS. IT'S ABOUT BUILDING A SELF-SUFFICIENT READER WHO CAN ADAPT TO NEW INFORMATION AND EXPAND THEIR KNOWLEDGE BASE EFFECTIVELY, MAKING CONTEXT CLUES A FOUNDATIONAL PILLAR OF HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION.

TYPES OF CONTEXT CLUES EVERY HIGH SCHOOLER SHOULD KNOW

TO EFFECTIVELY UTILIZE CONTEXT CLUES, STUDENTS NEED TO BE AWARE OF THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF HINTS AUTHORS PROVIDE. RECOGNIZING THESE PATTERNS ALLOWS FOR MORE TARGETED AND SUCCESSFUL WORD DECODING. HERE ARE THE PRIMARY TYPES OF CONTEXT CLUES THAT HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS SHOULD FAMILIARIZE THEMSELVES WITH:

- **DEFINITION OR EXPLANATION:** THE AUTHOR DIRECTLY PROVIDES THE MEANING OF AN UNFAMILIAR WORD, OFTEN USING PHRASES LIKE "WHICH MEANS," "THAT IS," OR PUNCTUATION LIKE COMMAS, PARENTHESES, OR DASHES. FOR EXAMPLE, "THE PROTAGONIST, THE MAIN CHARACTER, FACED A DIFFICULT DILEMMA."
- **SYNONYM OR RESTATEMENT:** THE AUTHOR USES WORDS OR PHRASES WITH SIMILAR MEANINGS TO EXPLAIN THE UNKNOWN WORD. THIS MIGHT INVOLVE RESTATING THE IDEA IN SIMPLER TERMS. AN EXAMPLE COULD BE, "HE WAS FAMISHED, MEANING EXTREMELY HUNGRY, AFTER THE LONG HIKE."
- **ANTONYM OR CONTRAST:** THE AUTHOR PROVIDES A WORD WITH AN OPPOSITE MEANING TO HELP THE READER UNDERSTAND THE TARGET WORD. SIGNAL WORDS LIKE "BUT," "HOWEVER," "ALTHOUGH," OR "UNLIKE" OFTEN INTRODUCE THESE CONTRASTS. CONSIDER, "WHILE SARAH WAS GREGARIOUS, HER BROTHER WAS QUITE RESERVED."
- **INFERENCE OR GENERAL CONTEXT:** THIS IS OFTEN THE MOST COMMON TYPE, WHERE THE READER MUST USE LOGICAL REASONING AND BACKGROUND KNOWLEDGE TO FIGURE OUT THE MEANING. THE SURROUNDING SENTENCES PROVIDE CLUES ABOUT THE WORD'S FUNCTION OR CONNOTATION. FOR INSTANCE, "THE ANCIENT ARTIFACT WAS INCREDIBLY FRAGILE; THE MUSEUM STAFF HANDLED IT WITH EXTREME CARE, KNOWING THAT ONE WRONG MOVE COULD CAUSE IT TO CRUMBLE." THE WORDS "FRAGILE" AND "HANDLED WITH EXTREME CARE" SUGGEST THAT THE ARTIFACT IS EASILY BROKEN.
- **EXAMPLE:** THE AUTHOR PROVIDES SPECIFIC EXAMPLES TO ILLUSTRATE THE MEANING OF AN UNFAMILIAR WORD. PHRASES LIKE "FOR EXAMPLE," "SUCH AS," OR "LIKE" OFTEN INTRODUCE THESE EXAMPLES. A SENTENCE LIKE, "MANY DECIDUOUS TREES, SUCH AS MAPLES AND OAKS, LOSE THEIR LEAVES IN THE FALL," HELPS DEFINE "DECIDUOUS."

BY UNDERSTANDING THESE DISTINCT CATEGORIES, HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS CAN APPROACH UNFAMILIAR VOCABULARY WITH A STRATEGIC MINDSET, ACTIVELY LOOKING FOR THE SPECIFIC TYPE OF CLUE THAT WILL LEAD THEM TO THE CORRECT MEANING.

STRATEGIES FOR USING CONTEXT CLUES EFFECTIVELY

KNOWING THE TYPES OF CONTEXT CLUES IS ONLY THE FIRST STEP; APPLYING THEM EFFECTIVELY REQUIRES A SYSTEMATIC APPROACH. HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS CAN DEVELOP ROBUST STRATEGIES TO ENHANCE THEIR ABILITY TO DECIPHER MEANING FROM CONTEXT. THE GOAL IS TO TRANSFORM VOCABULARY ACQUISITION FROM A PASSIVE PROCESS INTO AN ACTIVE, ENGAGING ONE.

ACTIVE READING AND ANNOTATION

ENCOURAGING STUDENTS TO ACTIVELY ENGAGE WITH THE TEXT IS CRUCIAL. THIS INVOLVES MORE THAN JUST READING THE WORDS; IT MEANS INTERACTING WITH THEM. HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS CAN BE TAUGHT TO UNDERLINE OR HIGHLIGHT UNFAMILIAR WORDS. NEXT, THEY SHOULD LOOK FOR SURROUNDING WORDS OR PHRASES THAT MIGHT OFFER CLUES. ANNOTATING BY THE SIDE OF THE TEXT WITH POSSIBLE DEFINITIONS OR NOTING THE TYPE OF CLUE BEING USED (E.G., "SYNONYM," "EXAMPLE") CAN BE INCREDIBLY BENEFICIAL FOR REINFORCING THE LEARNING PROCESS.

BREAKING DOWN SENTENCES

COMPLEX SENTENCES CAN BE INTIMIDATING, BUT BREAKING THEM DOWN INTO SMALLER, MORE MANAGEABLE PARTS CAN REVEAL HIDDEN CLUES. STUDENTS CAN BE ENCOURAGED TO IDENTIFY THE SUBJECT, VERB, AND OBJECT, AND THEN ANALYZE HOW THE UNFAMILIAR WORD FITS INTO THE SENTENCE'S OVERALL STRUCTURE AND MEANING. UNDERSTANDING THE GRAMMATICAL ROLE OF THE WORD CAN ALSO PROVIDE HINTS ABOUT ITS MEANING.

CONSIDERING THE OVERALL TONE AND SUBJECT

THE GENERAL SUBJECT MATTER AND THE AUTHOR'S TONE CAN ALSO PROVIDE SIGNIFICANT CONTEXT. IF A PASSAGE IS ABOUT A SCIENTIFIC DISCOVERY, THE UNFAMILIAR WORD IS LIKELY RELATED TO SCIENTIFIC CONCEPTS. IF THE TONE IS SERIOUS AND SOMBER, THE VOCABULARY WILL LIKELY REFLECT THAT. HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS SHOULD BE PROMPTED TO ASK THEMSELVES: "WHAT IS THIS PASSAGE GENERALLY ABOUT? WHAT KIND OF FEELING OR ATTITUDE IS THE AUTHOR CONVEYING?"

TESTING POTENTIAL MEANINGS

ONCE A STUDENT HAS INFERRED A POSSIBLE MEANING, THEY SHOULD TEST IT BY SUBSTITUTING IT BACK INTO THE ORIGINAL SENTENCE. DOES THE SENTENCE STILL MAKE SENSE? DOES THE NEW WORD FIT LOGICALLY WITH THE REST OF THE SENTENCE AND THE OVERALL PASSAGE? IF THE SUBSTITUTED WORD MAINTAINS THE ORIGINAL MEANING AND FLOW, IT'S LIKELY THE CORRECT INTERPRETATION. THIS SELF-CORRECTION STEP IS VITAL FOR ACCURATE UNDERSTANDING.

THE ESSENTIAL ROLE OF A CONTEXT CLUES WORKSHEET FOR HIGH SCHOOL

A WELL-DESIGNED **CONTEXT CLUES WORKSHEET HIGH SCHOOL** STUDENTS CAN UTILIZE IS AN INVALUABLE RESOURCE FOR PRACTICING AND SOLIDIFYING THESE ESSENTIAL SKILLS. WORKSHEETS PROVIDE A STRUCTURED ENVIRONMENT WHERE STUDENTS CAN DELIBERATELY APPLY THE STRATEGIES THEY'VE LEARNED. THEY OFFER TARGETED PRACTICE WITH SPECIFIC VOCABULARY IN ISOLATION FROM LONGER, MORE COMPLEX TEXTS, ALLOWING FOR FOCUSED SKILL DEVELOPMENT. THIS FOCUSED PRACTICE HELPS STUDENTS INTERNALIZE THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF CONTEXT CLUES AND HOW TO IDENTIFY THEM.

THESE WORKSHEETS OFTEN PRESENT SENTENCES OR SHORT PASSAGES THAT CONTAIN A TARGET WORD, FOLLOWED BY QUESTIONS THAT GUIDE STUDENTS TO IDENTIFY THE CLUES AND INFER THE MEANING. BY WORKING THROUGH A SERIES OF THESE EXERCISES, STUDENTS BUILD CONFIDENCE AND PROFICIENCY. THE REPETITION INHERENT IN WORKSHEET ACTIVITIES REINFORCES THE LEARNING PROCESS, MAKING THE IDENTIFICATION AND USE OF CONTEXT CLUES A MORE AUTOMATIC SKILL. ULTIMATELY, A **CONTEXT CLUES WORKSHEET HIGH SCHOOL** CURRICULUM NEEDS SHOULD SERVE AS A BRIDGE BETWEEN UNDERSTANDING THE CONCEPT AND APPLYING IT SUCCESSFULLY IN REAL-WORLD READING SITUATIONS.

DESIGNING AND UTILIZING A HIGH SCHOOL CONTEXT CLUES WORKSHEET

CREATING AN EFFECTIVE **CONTEXT CLUES WORKSHEET HIGH SCHOOL** TEACHERS AND STUDENTS CAN BENEFIT FROM INVOLVES CAREFUL CONSIDERATION OF SEVERAL ELEMENTS. THE GOAL IS TO PROVIDE CHALLENGING YET ACHIEVABLE PRACTICE THAT CATERS TO THE VOCABULARY LEVEL OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS. A GOOD WORKSHEET WILL INCORPORATE A VARIETY OF SENTENCE STRUCTURES AND DEMONSTRATE MULTIPLE TYPES OF CONTEXT CLUES.

CONTENT SELECTION

THE VOCABULARY CHOSEN FOR THE WORKSHEET SHOULD BE APPROPRIATE FOR THE HIGH SCHOOL LEVEL, INCLUDING WORDS THAT ARE COMMONLY ENCOUNTERED IN ACADEMIC TEXTS OR LITERATURE STUDIED IN HIGH SCHOOL. IT'S BENEFICIAL TO SELECT WORDS THAT STUDENTS MIGHT GENUINELY STRUGGLE WITH BUT CAN DECIPHER USING CONTEXT. THE SENTENCES THEMSELVES SHOULD BE CLEAR AND PROVIDE SUFFICIENT CLUES WITHOUT BEING OVERLY SIMPLISTIC.

STRUCTURE AND FORMAT

A TYPICAL **CONTEXT CLUES WORKSHEET HIGH SCHOOL** MIGHT BE STRUCTURED AS FOLLOWS:

- EACH ITEM PRESENTS A SENTENCE OR SHORT PARAGRAPH WITH AN UNDERLINED OR BOLDED TARGET WORD.
- STUDENTS ARE THEN ASKED TO IDENTIFY THE TYPE OF CONTEXT CLUE USED (E.G., DEFINITION, SYNONYM, INFERENCE).
- FOLLOWING THAT, STUDENTS WRITE DOWN WHAT THEY BELIEVE THE WORD MEANS, BASED ON THE CLUES.
- AN OPTIONAL BUT HIGHLY BENEFICIAL STEP IS TO HAVE STUDENTS THEN LOOK UP THE WORD IN A DICTIONARY TO CONFIRM THEIR INFERRED MEANING. THIS REINFORCES THE ACCURACY OF THEIR CONTEXT CLUE USAGE.

PROVIDING AN ANSWER KEY IS ESSENTIAL FOR SELF-ASSESSMENT AND FOR TEACHERS TO QUICKLY CHECK STUDENT PROGRESS. THE DESIGN SHOULD BE CLEAN AND EASY TO READ, ENSURING THAT THE FOCUS REMAINS ON THE VOCABULARY AND THE CONTEXT.

IMPLEMENTATION IN THE CLASSROOM

TEACHERS CAN INTRODUCE A **CONTEXT CLUES WORKSHEET HIGH SCHOOL** BY FIRST REVIEWING THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF CONTEXT CLUES. THEY MIGHT MODEL HOW TO APPROACH A FEW EXAMPLES FROM THE WORKSHEET, THINKING ALOUD TO DEMONSTRATE THE PROCESS. STUDENTS CAN THEN WORK INDIVIDUALLY OR IN PAIRS TO COMPLETE THE WORKSHEET. CLASS DISCUSSIONS FOLLOWING THE ACTIVITY CAN ADDRESS ANY CHALLENGING WORDS OR COMMON MISCONCEPTIONS. SOME TEACHERS MAY ALSO ASSIGN THESE WORKSHEETS FOR HOMEWORK TO REINFORCE LEARNING OUTSIDE OF DIRECT INSTRUCTION.

COMMON CHALLENGES AND SOLUTIONS WITH CONTEXT CLUES WORKSHEETS

DESPITE THE CLEAR BENEFITS, HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS SOMETIMES ENCOUNTER DIFFICULTIES WHEN WORKING WITH CONTEXT CLUES WORKSHEETS. UNDERSTANDING THESE COMMON CHALLENGES CAN HELP BOTH STUDENTS AND EDUCATORS FIND EFFECTIVE SOLUTIONS TO ENSURE MASTERY OF THIS VITAL SKILL.

DIFFICULTY IDENTIFYING THE TYPE OF CLUE

STUDENTS MAY STRUGGLE TO PINPOINT THE SPECIFIC TYPE OF CONTEXT CLUE BEING USED. FOR INSTANCE, DISTINGUISHING BETWEEN A SYNONYM AND AN INFERENCE CAN BE TRICKY.

SOLUTION: REGULAR REVIEW AND EXPLICIT INSTRUCTION ON EACH TYPE OF CLUE ARE CRUCIAL. PROVIDING SENTENCE FRAMES OR

GRAPHIC ORGANIZERS THAT PROMPT STUDENTS TO LOOK FOR SIGNAL WORDS (LIKE "WHICH MEANS" OR "BUT") CAN ALSO BE HELPFUL. PRACTICING WITH EXAMPLES THAT CLEARLY DEMONSTRATE EACH TYPE BEFORE MOVING TO MORE AMBIGUOUS ONES IS RECOMMENDED.

INSUFFICIENT OR MISLEADING CLUES

NOT ALL SENTENCES ARE CREATED EQUAL, AND SOME MAY CONTAIN WEAK OR EVEN MISLEADING CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION. THIS CAN LEAD TO FRUSTRATION WHEN STUDENTS ARE UNABLE TO DETERMINE A WORD'S MEANING.

SOLUTION: WHEN DESIGNING WORKSHEETS, PRIORITIZE SENTENCES WITH CLEAR AND SUPPORTIVE CLUES. FOR INSTANCES WHERE CLUES ARE GENUINELY AMBIGUOUS, IT'S IMPORTANT TO ACKNOWLEDGE THIS AND PERHAPS ENCOURAGE STUDENTS TO NOTE THE AMBIGUITY OR TO USE A DICTIONARY AFTER ATTEMPTING TO INFER. TEACHERS CAN ALSO MODEL HOW TO RECOGNIZE WHEN CONTEXT MIGHT NOT BE ENOUGH AND WHEN TO CONSULT EXTERNAL RESOURCES.

OVER-RELIANCE ON PRIOR KNOWLEDGE

SOME STUDENTS MAY RELY TOO HEAVILY ON WORDS THEY ALREADY KNOW, OR ON EDUCATED GUESSES, RATHER THAN ACTIVELY SEEKING OUT THE PROVIDED CONTEXT CLUES.

SOLUTION: EMPHASIZE THE PROCESS OF FINDING SPECIFIC TEXTUAL EVIDENCE. WORKSHEETS CAN BE DESIGNED TO REQUIRE STUDENTS TO QUOTE THE SPECIFIC WORDS OR PHRASES FROM THE SENTENCE THAT HELPED THEM DETERMINE THE MEANING. THIS FORCES THEM TO ENGAGE WITH THE TEXT RATHER THAN JUST GUESSING.

LACK OF ENGAGEMENT

LIKE ANY REPETITIVE EXERCISE, WORKSHEETS CAN SOMETIMES FEEL MONOTONOUS.

SOLUTION: GAMIFICATION CAN BE A POWERFUL TOOL. TEACHERS CAN TURN WORKSHEET COMPLETION INTO A FRIENDLY COMPETITION, OR STUDENTS CAN EARN POINTS FOR CORRECTLY IDENTIFYING CLUES AND MEANINGS. VARYING THE FORMAT OF PRACTICE, INCORPORATING INTERACTIVE ONLINE ACTIVITIES, OR USING EXCERPTS FROM ENGAGING HIGH SCHOOL READING MATERIALS CAN ALSO BOOST STUDENT INTEREST.

BEYOND WORKSHEETS: INTEGRATING CONTEXT CLUES INTO DAILY READING

WHILE **CONTEXT CLUES WORKSHEETS FOR HIGH SCHOOL** ARE EXCELLENT FOR FOCUSED PRACTICE, THE ULTIMATE GOAL IS FOR STUDENTS TO APPLY THESE SKILLS SEAMLESSLY IN THEIR EVERYDAY READING. INTEGRATING CONTEXT CLUE STRATEGIES INTO REGULAR READING HABITS IS KEY TO LONG-TERM VOCABULARY DEVELOPMENT AND IMPROVED COMPREHENSION.

ACTIVE READING IN ALL SUBJECTS

ENCOURAGE STUDENTS TO USE CONTEXT CLUES NOT JUST IN ENGLISH OR LITERATURE CLASSES, BUT ACROSS ALL SUBJECTS. SCIENCE TEXTBOOKS, HISTORY DOCUMENTS, AND EVEN MATH WORD PROBLEMS CONTAIN VOCABULARY THAT CAN OFTEN BE DECIPHERED THROUGH CONTEXT. TEACHERS IN ALL DISCIPLINES CAN MODEL THIS BEHAVIOR AND PROMPT STUDENTS TO EXPLAIN HOW THEY FIGURED OUT THE MEANING OF AN UNFAMILIAR TERM.

CLASSROOM DISCUSSIONS AND DEBATES

DURING CLASS DISCUSSIONS, TEACHERS CAN PAUSE WHEN AN UNFAMILIAR WORD IS USED AND ASK STUDENTS, "HOW DO YOU KNOW WHAT THAT WORD MEANS? WHAT CLUES DID YOU FIND IN THE SENTENCE?" THIS ENCOURAGES ACTIVE PARTICIPATION AND REINFORCES THE PROCESS. IT ALSO HIGHLIGHTS THE COMMUNAL ASPECT OF LEARNING AND PROBLEM-SOLVING.

INDEPENDENT READING CHOICES

SUPPORTING STUDENTS IN CHOOSING BOOKS OR ARTICLES THAT ARE SLIGHTLY CHALLENGING BUT STILL ACCESSIBLE IS IMPORTANT. WHEN STUDENTS ENCOUNTER NEW WORDS DURING INDEPENDENT READING, THEY SHOULD BE ENCOURAGED TO TRY AND DECIPHER THEM USING CONTEXT BEFORE IMMEDIATELY REACHING FOR A DICTIONARY. THIS BUILDS SELF-RELIANCE AND MAKES READING A MORE REWARDING EXPERIENCE.

VOCABULARY JOURNALS

STUDENTS CAN MAINTAIN VOCABULARY JOURNALS WHERE THEY RECORD UNFAMILIAR WORDS ENCOUNTERED DURING THEIR READING. FOR EACH WORD, THEY SHOULD NOTE THE SENTENCE IT APPEARED IN, THE CONTEXT CLUES THEY IDENTIFIED, THEIR INFERRED DEFINITION, AND THE ACTUAL DICTIONARY DEFINITION. THIS CREATES A PERSONAL, GROWING LEXICON AND REINFORCES THE LEARNING CYCLE.

CONCLUSION: MASTERING VOCABULARY WITH CONTEXT CLUES
