## CONTINUING EDUCATION AND PROFESSIONAL GROWTH

EBP IS A DYNAMIC PROCESS THAT BALANCES THESE THREE ELEMENTS.



## EVALUATING THE EFFECTIVENESS OF INTERVENTIONS

PART OF PRACTICING EVIDENCE-BASED SOCIAL WORK INVOLVES ONGOING EVALUATION OF THE EFFECTIVENESS OF INTERVENTIONS.
