THE ECONOMIC IMPACT ON RURAL COMMUNITIES

THE ECONOMIC FALLOUT FROM THE DEPRESSION MEANT THAT EVEN FOR THOSE WHO MANAGED TO HOLD ONTO THEIR FARMS OR FIND WORK, WAGES WERE PITIFULLY LOW. THE AGRICULTURAL SECTOR, ALREADY STRUGGLING WITH OVERPRODUCTION AND FALLING PRICES, WAS FURTHER DEVASTATED BY THE DUST BOWL. MANY FARMERS WERE FORCED INTO BANKRUPTCY AND LOST THEIR LAND. THIS ECONOMIC RUIN WAS THE PRIMARY DRIVER OF THE MASS EXODUS FROM THE PLAINS STATES. THE DESPERATION FOR EMPLOYMENT MEANT THAT A SURPLUS OF LABOR WAS READILY AVAILABLE, WHICH IN TURN DROVE DOWN WAGES EVEN FURTHER FOR FARMWORKERS, CREATING A CYCLE OF POVERTY AND EXPLOITATION.

THE ENVIRONMENTAL CATASTROPHE

THE DUST BOWL WAS NOT MERELY A NATURAL DISASTER; IT WAS ALSO A CONSEQUENCE OF UNSUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURAL PRACTICES. THE PERVERSIVE GRIP OF POVERTY

THE ENDURING SPIRIT OF RESILIENCE

DESPITE THE IMMENSE SUFFERING, "THE HARVEST GYPSIES" ALSO SHOWCASES THE ENDURING SPIRIT OF RESILIENCE. THE MIGRANT FAMILIES FOUND WAYS TO COPE WITH THEIR DIFFICULT CIRCUMSTANCES. HEALTHCARE AND PUBLIC HEALTH

ACCESS TO HEALTHCARE WAS VIRTUALLY NON-EXISTENT FOR MOST MIGRANT FARMWORKERS. MEDICAL FACILITIES WERE SCARCE IN THE RURAL AREAS WHERE THEY WORKED, AND EVEN IF AVAILABLE, THE COST WAS PROHIBITIVE. ILLNESSES, OFTEN EXACERBATED BY POOR NUTRITION AND UNSANITARY LIVING CONDITIONS, WERE COMMON. THE SHIFT FROM SUSTAINABLE FARMING TO MORE INTENSIVE, LAND-DEGRADING METHODS SET THE STAGE FOR ECOLOGICAL COLLAPSE, WHICH IN TURN FUELED THE ECONOMIC DESPERATION THAT DROVE THE MIGRATION.

UNSUSTAINABLE FARMING TECHNIQUES
