UNDERSTANDING THESE DEVICES IS NOT JUST ABOUT ACADEMIC KNOWLEDGE; IT'S ABOUT APPRECIATING THE ARTISTRY OF LANGUAGE AND HOW IT SHAPES OUR PERCEPTION OF THE WORLD.

KEY TYPES OF FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE FOR CROSSWORD PUZZLES

CROSSWORD PUZZLES OFTEN DRAW FROM A CORE SET OF FREQUENTLY USED FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE DEVICES. SIMILE: THE ART OF COMPARISON

A SIMILE IS A FIGURE OF SPEECH THAT DIRECTLY COMPARES TWO DIFFERENT THINGS, USUALLY BY EMPLOYING THE WORDS "LIKE" OR "AS." THE PURPOSE IS TO HIGHLIGHT A SHARED QUALITY OR CHARACTERISTIC, MAKING THE DESCRIPTION MORE VIVID AND RELATABLE. FOR INSTANCE, "AS BRAVE AS A LION" USES "AS" TO COMPARE SOMEONE'S BRAVERY TO THAT OF A LION. IN CROSSWORDS, CLUES MIGHT REFER TO A SIMILE BY DESCRIBING THE COMPARISON ITSELF OR USING SYNONYMS FOR "LIKE" OR "AS."

METAPHOR: IMPLIED COMPARISON

UNLIKE SIMILES, METAPHORS MAKE AN IMPLICIT COMPARISON BETWEEN TWO UNLIKE THINGS WITHOUT USING "LIKE" OR "AS." THEY STATE THAT ONE THING IS ANOTHER, SUGGESTING A RESEMBLANCE. "THE WORLD IS A STAGE" IS A CLASSIC METAPHOR, EQUATING THE WORLD TO A THEATRICAL SETTING. CROSSWORD CLUES FOR METAPHORS OFTEN DESCRIBE THE OBJECT BEING DESCRIBED AS THE THING IT'S BEING COMPARED TO, OR THEY MIGHT USE PHRASES THAT IMPLY EQUIVALENCE.

PERSONIFICATION: GIVING LIFE TO THE INANIMATE

PERSONIFICATION IMBUES INANIMATE OBJECTS, ANIMALS, OR ABSTRACT IDEAS WITH HUMAN QUALITIES, EMOTIONS, OR ACTIONS. WHEN WE SAY "THE WIND WHISPERED SECRETS," WE ARE ATTRIBUTING THE HUMAN ACT OF WHISPERING TO THE WIND. THIS DEVICE BREATHES LIFE INTO DESCRIPTIONS, MAKING THEM MORE ENGAGING. CLUES FOR PERSONIFICATION IN CROSSWORDS MIGHT DESCRIBE AN OBJECT PERFORMING A HUMAN ACTION.

HYPERBOLE: EXAGGERATION FOR EFFECT

HYPERBOLE IS THE INTENTIONAL EXAGGERATION OF A STATEMENT FOR EMPHASIS OR EFFECT. IT'S NOT MEANT TO BE TAKEN LITERALLY. SAYING "I'VE TOLD YOU A MILLION TIMES" IS A HYPERBOLIC WAY OF EXPRESSING REPETITION. THIS TECHNIQUE ADDS HUMOR, INTENSITY, OR DRAMA TO A STATEMENT. CROSSWORD CLUES FOR HYPERBOLE OFTEN INVOLVE EXTREME STATEMENTS OR DESCRIPTIONS OF EXAGGERATION.

ONOMATOPOEIA: WORDS THAT MIMIC SOUNDS

ONOMATOPOEIA REFERS TO WORDS THAT IMITATE THE NATURAL SOUNDS OF THINGS. EXAMPLES INCLUDE "BUZZ," "MEOW," "CRASH," AND "HISS." THESE WORDS DIRECTLY REPRESENT THE SOUND THEY DESCRIBE, ADDING AN AUDITORY DIMENSION TO LANGUAGE. CROSSWORD PUZZLES WILL OFTEN CLUE THESE WITH DESCRIPTIONS OF THE SOUND ITSELF OR THE ACTION THAT PRODUCES IT.

ALLITERATION: THE SWEET SOUND OF REPETITION

ALLITERATION IS THE REPETITION OF THE INITIAL CONSONANT SOUND IN WORDS THAT ARE CLOSE TOGETHER. "PETER PIPER PICKED A PECK OF PICKLED PEPPERS" IS A FAMOUS EXAMPLE. THIS STYLISTIC DEVICE CREATES A MUSICALITY AND RHYTHM IN LANGUAGE, MAKING IT MORE MEMORABLE. CLUES FOR ALLITERATION IN CROSSWORDS MIGHT HINT AT REPEATED SOUNDS OR ALLUDE TO FAMOUS EXAMPLES.

ASSONANCE: THE ECHO OF VOWELS

ASSONANCE IS THE REPETITION OF VOWEL SOUNDS WITHIN WORDS THAT ARE CLOSE TOGETHER, WHILE THE SURROUNDING CONSONANTS DIFFER. CONSIDER THE "O" SOUND IN "GO SLOW OVER THE ROAD." UNLIKE ALLITERATION, WHICH FOCUSES ON CONSONANT SOUNDS, ASSONANCE HIGHLIGHTS VOWEL SOUNDS. THIS CAN CREATE A SUBTLE FLOW AND MUSICALITY. CROSSWORD CLUES MIGHT DESCRIBE REPEATED VOWEL SOUNDS OR PROVIDE PHRASES WHERE THEY OCCUR.

CONSONANCE: REPEATING CONSONANTS

CONSONANCE IS THE REPETITION OF CONSONANT SOUNDS WITHIN WORDS THAT ARE CLOSE TOGETHER, BUT WITH DIFFERENT VOWEL SOUNDS PRECEDING THEM. AN EXAMPLE IS "MIKE LIKES HIS NEW BIKE." THE REPEATED "K" SOUND IS CONSONANCE. THIS DEVICE ADDS A SONIC TEXTURE TO TEXT. CROSSWORD CLUES FOR CONSONANCE MIGHT FOCUS ON THE REPETITION OF SPECIFIC CONSONANT SOUNDS IN A PHRASE OR WORD.

OXYMORON: CONTRADICTIONARY TERMS

AN OXYMORON COMBINES TWO CONTRADICTIONARY TERMS TO CREATE A SURPRISING OR THOUGHT-PROVOKING EFFECT. "JUMBO SHRIMP," "BITTER SWEET," AND "DEAFENING SILENCE" ARE COMMON EXAMPLES. THIS FIGURE OF SPEECH CREATES A STRIKING CONTRAST. CLUES FOR OXYMORONS IN CROSSWORDS OFTEN PRESENT THE CONTRADICTIONARY TERMS DIRECTLY OR HINT AT THE PARADOXICAL NATURE OF THE PHRASE.

IRONY: SAYING ONE THING, MEANING ANOTHER

IRONY, IN ITS VARIOUS FORMS (VERBAL, SITUATIONAL, DRAMATIC), INVOLVES A CONTRAST BETWEEN WHAT IS SAID AND WHAT IS MEANT, OR BETWEEN EXPECTATION AND REALITY. VERBAL IRONY IS AKIN TO SARCASM. SITUATIONAL IRONY OCCURS WHEN THE OUTCOME OF A SITUATION IS CONTRARY TO WHAT WAS EXPECTED. DRAMATIC IRONY HAPPENS WHEN THE AUDIENCE KNOWS SOMETHING A CHARACTER DOESN'T. CROSSWORD CLUES FOR IRONY OFTEN DESCRIBE SITUATIONS OR STATEMENTS WHERE THERE'S A CLEAR DISCREPANCY BETWEEN APPEARANCE AND REALITY.

DECODING FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE CROSSWORD CLUES

SOLVING FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE CROSSWORDS REQUIRES MORE THAN JUST KNOWING DEFINITIONS; IT INVOLVES SKILLFUL INTERPRETATION OF CLUES. CLUES ARE OFTEN DESIGNED TO BE INDIRECT, REQUIRING YOU TO RECOGNIZE THE UNDERLYING LITERARY DEVICE AT PLAY. RECOGNIZING KEYWORD INDICATORS

SOME CLUES MIGHT CONTAIN EXPLICIT KEYWORDS THAT SIGNAL THE PRESENCE OF FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE. FOR INSTANCE, A CLUE MIGHT READ, "COMPARISON USING 'LIKE' (7 LETTERS)." THIS DIRECTLY POINTS TO A SIMILE. OTHER INDICATORS MIGHT BE WORDS LIKE "COMPARISON," "EXAGGERATION," "SOUND," "REPETITION," OR DESCRIPTIONS OF CONTRADICTIONARY TERMS. LEARNING TO SPOT THESE KEYWORDS IS THE FIRST STEP TO UNLOCKING THE CLUE.

INTERPRETING DESCRIPTIVE CLUES

MANY CLUES WILL NOT USE DIRECT KEYWORDS BUT WILL INSTEAD DESCRIBE THE FUNCTION OR EFFECT OF A FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE DEVICE. A CLUE FOR PERSONIFICATION MIGHT BE, "WIND'S MOURNFUL CRY (10 LETTERS)." HERE, "MOURNFUL CRY" DESCRIBES AN ACTION TYPICALLY ASSOCIATED WITH HUMANS, APPLIED TO THE WIND. SIMILARLY, A CLUE FOR HYPERBOLE COULD BE, "SAID I'D WAIT FOREVER (7 LETTERS)," IMPLYING AN EXAGGERATED STATEMENT.

UNDERSTANDING THE NUANCES OF WORDPLAY

CROSSWORDS THRIVE ON WORDPLAY, AND FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE CLUES ARE NO EXCEPTION. SOMETIMES, THE ANSWER ITSELF IS A WORD THAT EMBODIES THE FIGURATIVE DEVICE. FOR EXAMPLE, THE ANSWER MIGHT BE "METAPHOR" IF THE CLUE DESCRIBES AN IMPLIED COMPARISON. OTHER TIMES, THE ANSWER WILL BE A SPECIFIC EXAMPLE OF THE DEVICE, LIKE "ONION" IF THE CLUE IS "CRY AFTER CUTTING, PERHAPS (5 LETTERS)," ALLUDING TO THE EFFECT OF CUTTING AN ONION WHICH CAN MAKE YOU CRY (SIMILE OR HYPERBOLE). THE LENGTH OF THE ANSWER IS ALWAYS A CRUCIAL GUIDE.

HYPERBOLE (9 LETTERS)

- **DEFINITION:** EXAGGERATION FOR EMPHASIS OR EFFECT.

- **COMMON ANSWERS:** HYPERBOLE, EXAGGERATION
- **CLUE EXAMPLES:** "OVERSTATEMENT," "EXTREME EXAGGERATION," "SAID I'D WAIT FOREVER."

ONOMATOPOEIA (12 LETTERS)

ALLUSION (7 LETTERS)

- **DEFINITION:** AN INDIRECT REFERENCE TO A PERSON, PLACE, THING, OR IDEA OF HISTORICAL, CULTURAL, LITERARY, OR POLITICAL SIGNIFICANCE.

ANALOGY (7 LETTERS)

- **DEFINITION:** A COMPARISON BETWEEN TWO THINGS, TYPICALLY FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXPLANATION OR CLARIFICATION.
- **COMMON ANSWERS:** ANALOGY, COMPARISON

SYNECDOCHE (10 LETTERS)

- **DEFINITION:** A FIGURE OF SPEECH IN WHICH A PART IS MADE TO REPRESENT THE WHOLE OR VICE VERSA. FOR EXAMPLE, "WHEELS" TO MEAN A CAR.

METONYMY (8 LETTERS)

- **DEFINITION:** SUBSTITUTING THE NAME OF AN ATTRIBUTE OR ADJUNCT FOR THAT OF THE THING MEANT. FOR EXAMPLE, "THE CROWN" FOR THE MONARCHY.
- **COMMON ANSWERS:** METONYMY, SUBSTITUTE
- **CLUE EXAMPLES:** "SUBSTITUTION FOR EFFECT," "THE WHITE HOUSE SAID..." (REFERRING TO THE ADMINISTRATION), "REFERRING TO A KING AS 'THE CROWN'."

EXPLANATION: THE CLUE PRESENTS A METAPHORICAL STATEMENT WHERE LIFE IS EQUATED TO A GAMBLE, IMPLYING CHANCE AND RISK.

CLUE: "THE CLASSROOM WAS A ___ OF ACTIVITY" (5 LETTERS)

ANSWER: ZOO

EXPLANATION: THIS METAPHOR EQUATES THE CLASSROOM'S CHAOTIC NATURE TO THAT OF A ZOO, SUGGESTING A LIVELY AND PERHAPS UNRULY ENVIRONMENT.

PERSONIFICATION EXAMPLES

CLUE: "THE FLOWERS ___ IN THE BREEZE" (4 LETTERS)

ANSWER: DANCED

EXPLANATION: "DANCED" IS A HUMAN ACTION ATTRIBUTED TO FLOWERS, A CLEAR INSTANCE OF PERSONIFICATION.

CLUE: "OPPORTUNITY ___ AT HIS DOOR" (4 LETTERS)

ANSWER: KNOCKED

EXPLANATION: "KNOCKED" IS A HUMAN ACTION IMPLYING PRESENCE AND ARRIVAL, GIVEN TO THE ABSTRACT CONCEPT OF OPPORTUNITY.

HYPERBOLE EXAMPLES

EXPLANATION: THIS IS A CLASSIC HYPERBOLIC STATEMENT EXPRESSING EXTREME HUNGER.

CLUE: "WAITED ___ FOR THE BUS" (4 LETTERS)

ANSWER: AGES

EXPLANATION: "AGES" IS AN EXAGGERATION TO DESCRIBE A PROLONGED WAITING PERIOD.

ONOMATOPOEIA EXAMPLES

CLUE: "THE ___ OF THE CLOCK" (5 LETTERS)

ANSWER: TICKING

EXPLANATION: "TICKING" IS A WORD THAT IMITATES THE SOUND OF A CLOCK.

CLUE: "A CAT'S ___" (4 LETTERS)

ANSWER: MEOW

EXPLANATION: "MEOW" IS THE SOUND A CAT MAKES, REPRESENTED BY AN ONOMATOPOEIC WORD.

STRATEGIES FOR SOLVING FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE CROSSWORDS

BUILD YOUR VOCABULARY

ANALYZE THE CLUE CAREFULLY

BREAK DOWN EACH CLUE. IDENTIFY ANY KEYWORDS. CONSIDER THE CONTEXT AND THE IMPLIED MEANING. ASK YOURSELF: IS THIS A COMPARISON? IS IT AN EXAGGERATION? DOES IT INVOLVE SOUND? THE MORE YOU DISSECT THE CLUE, THE CLEARER THE PATH TO THE ANSWER WILL BECOME.

UTILIZE THE GRID

THE CROSSWORD GRID ITSELF IS YOUR GREATEST ALLY. THE NUMBER OF LETTERS IN THE ANSWER IS A DEFINITIVE CONSTRAINT. FURTHERMORE, AS YOU FILL IN INTERSECTING WORDS, YOU GAIN LETTERS THAT CAN HELP CONFIRM OR SUGGEST ANSWERS FOR FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE CLUES.

CONSIDER SYNONYMS AND RELATED CONCEPTS

FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE TERMS ARE OFTEN RELATED. FOR INSTANCE, A CLUE ABOUT "SAYING THE OPPOSITE OF WHAT'S MEANT" COULD LEAD TO IRONY OR SARCASTIC. THINK ABOUT THE BROADER CATEGORY AND SPECIFIC EXAMPLES. SIMILARLY, FOR ALLITERATION, CONSIDER THE SOUND ITSELF OR FAMOUS EXAMPLES OF ALLITERATIVE PHRASES.

PRACTICE REGULARLY

LIKE ANY SKILL, SOLVING FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE CROSSWORDS IMPROVES WITH PRACTICE. THE MORE PUZZLES YOU ATTEMPT, THE MORE FAMILIAR YOU'LL BECOME WITH COMMON CLUE PATTERNS AND ANSWERS. SEEK OUT THEMED PUZZLES OR SECTIONS DEDICATED TO LITERARY TERMS.

WHEN STUCK, LOOK FOR PATTERNS

IF A CLUE IS PARTICULARLY ELUSIVE, TRY TO RECALL COMMON PATTERNS. FOR EXAMPLE, CLUES DESCRIBING CONTRADICTORY PAIRS STRONGLY SUGGEST AN OXYMORON. CLUES ABOUT REPEATING SOUNDS POINT TOWARDS ALLITERATION, ASSONANCE, OR CONSONANCE.

- **DEFINITION:** DIRECTLY ADDRESSING AN ABSENT PERSON, AN ABSTRACT IDEA, OR A THING.
- **COMMON ANSWERS:** APOSTROPHE, ADDRESSING
- **CLUE EXAMPLES:** "O ROMEO, ROMEO, WHEREFORE ART THOU __," "SPEAKING TO AN ABSENT LOVER," "DIRECT

ADDRESS TO AN OBJECT."

LITOTES (7 LETTERS)

- **DEFINITION:** UNDERSTATEMENT BY USING THE OPPOSITE OF WHAT IS MEANT, OFTEN WITH A NEGATIVE. FOR EXAMPLE, "NOT BAD" MEANING "GOOD."
- **COMMON ANSWERS:** LITOTES, DOUBLE NEGATIVE
- **CLUE EXAMPLES:** "NOT BAD" FOR "GOOD," "AN UNDERSTATEMENT USING NEGATION," "HE'S NO FOOL."

ANAPHORA (8 LETTERS)

- **DEFINITION:** THE REPETITION OF A WORD OR PHRASE AT THE BEGINNING OF SUCCESSIVE CLAUSES OR SENTENCES.
- **COMMON ANSWERS:** ANAPHORA, REPETITIVE OPENING
- **CLUE EXAMPLES:** "REPETITION AT THE START OF CLAUSES," "I HAVE A DREAM... I HAVE A DREAM...", "MARTIN LUTHER KING'S REPETITIVE PHRASE."
