EGYPTIAN ART: ETERNITY, ORDER, AND THE DIVINE

TOMB ART AND THE AFTERLIFE

A SIGNIFICANT PORTION OF SURVIVING EGYPTIAN ART COMES FROM TOMBS, INTENDED TO PROVIDE FOR THE DECEASED IN THE AFTERLIFE. AEGEAN ART: BRONZE AGE CULTURES OF THE MEDITERRANEAN

FOLLOWING THE CONQUESTS OF ALEXANDER THE GREAT, THE HELLENISTIC PERIOD SAW A SHIFT TOWARDS GREATER EMOTIONAL EXPRESSION, DRAMATIC MOVEMENT, AND A WIDER RANGE OF SUBJECT MATTER IN GREEK ART. THE SPREAD OF GREEK CULTURE AND ARTISTIC INFLUENCE ACROSS THE VAST HELLENISTIC EMPIRES IS A SIGNIFICANT ASPECT DISCUSSED, LEADING TO A FUSION OF GREEK AND EASTERN ARTISTIC TRADITIONS.

ETRUSCAN AND ROMAN ART: ENGINEERING, EMPIRE, AND REALISM
