FOUNDATIONS OF AMERICAN GOVERNMENT AND THE CONSTITUTION

FEDERALISM: DIVISION OF POWERS AND INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS

THE AMERICAN TWO-PARTY SYSTEM

STRATEGIES OF INTEREST GROUP INFLUENCE

INTEREST GROUPS EMPLOY A VARIETY OF SOPHISTICATED STRATEGIES TO EXERT INFLUENCE OVER POLICYMAKERS AND PUBLIC OPINION. LOBBYING, THE DIRECT ATTEMPT TO INFLUENCE GOVERNMENT DECISION-MAKERS, IS A PRIMARY TOOL. THIS CAN INVOLVE PROVIDING INFORMATION, TESTIFYING AT HEARINGS, AND BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS WITH ELECTED OFFICIALS. INTEREST GROUPS ALSO ENGAGE IN POLITICAL ACTION BY CONTRIBUTING TO POLITICAL CAMPAIGNS THROUGH POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEES (PACs) AND SUPER PACs, AIMING TO ELECT CANDIDATES WHO ARE SYMPATHETIC TO THEIR CAUSES. FURTHERMORE, MANY GROUPS ENGAGE IN PUBLIC RELATIONS AND GRASSROOTS LOBBYING, AIMING TO MOBILIZE PUBLIC SUPPORT AND PRESSURE ELECTED OFFICIALS. CIVIL LIBERTIES AND CIVIL RIGHTS
