THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION AND THE FOUNDING OF A NATION

THE FIGHT FOR INDEPENDENCE IS A CENTRAL THEME IN FIFTH-GRADE US HISTORY. THE IMPACT OF WESTWARD EXPANSION ON NATIVE AMERICAN POPULATIONS AND THE GROWING SECTIONAL TENSIONS THAT WOULD EVENTUALLY LEAD TO THE CIVIL WAR ARE ALSO FREQUENTLY COVERED.
