UNDERSTANDING THIS PROGRESSION OF EVENTS, FROM RELATIVE NORMALCY TO THE BRINK OF ANNIHILATION, IS VITAL TO GRASPING THE NARRATIVE ARC OF NIGHT.

KEY THEMES EXPLORED IN NIGHT BY ELIE WIESEL

THE STRUGGLE FOR SURVIVAL

THIS SPIRITUAL STRUGGLE IS A POWERFUL EXPLORATION OF DOUBT AND THE SEARCH FOR MEANING AMIDST OVERWHELMING DESPAIR.

DEHUMANIZATION AND ITS EFFECTS

THE NAZI REGIME'S SYSTEMATIC EFFORT TO DEHUMANIZE ITS VICTIMS IS A CRITICAL THEME IN NIGHT. FAITH AND DOUBT IN NIGHT: THE QUESTIONING OF GOD
