POPULAR COOPERATIVE LEARNING STRATEGIES

THINK-PAIR-SHARE

JIGSAW

JIGSAW IS A COOPERATIVE LEARNING TECHNIQUE WHERE STUDENTS BECOME EXPERTS ON A SEGMENT OF THE MATERIAL AND THEN TEACH IT TO THEIR PEERS. THE CLASS IS DIVIDED INTO “HOME GROUPS” AND “EXPERT GROUPS,” FACILITATING INTERDEPENDENCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY. THIS STRATEGY ENHANCES COMPREHENSION AND ENCOURAGES RESPONSIBILITY FOR ONE’S LEARNING.

ROUND ROBIN

ROUND ROBIN INVOLVES STUDENTS TAKING TURNS TO CONTRIBUTE IDEAS OR ANSWERS IN A SEQUENTIAL MANNER. THIS APPROACH ENSURES EQUAL PARTICIPATION AND HELPS SHY OR RELUCTANT STUDENTS TO ENGAGE. IT IS PARTICULARLY USEFUL FOR BRAINSTORMING SESSIONS AND REVIEWING CONTENT COLLABORATIVELY.

STRUCTURED GROUP ACTIVITIES

GALLERY WALK

GALLERY WALK IS AN INTERACTIVE STRATEGY WHERE GROUPS CREATE VISUAL OR WRITTEN RESPONSES TO PROMPTS DISPLAYED AROUND THE CLASSROOM. STUDENTS ROTATE IN GROUPS TO REVIEW AND ADD TO EACH OTHER'S WORK. THIS ACTIVITY FOSTERS CRITICAL ANALYSIS AND PEER FEEDBACK IN A DYNAMIC SETTING.

INTERACTIVE TECHNIQUES FOR COLLABORATION
