GHANA EMPIRE

THE GHANA EMPIRE WAS STRATEGICALLY LOCATED BETWEEN THE SAHARA DESERT AND FORESTS OF WEST AFRICA, FACILITATING TRADE IN GOLD, SALT, AND OTHER GOODS. IT ESTABLISHED A COMPLEX TAXATION SYSTEM ON TRADE CARAVANS AND MAINTAINED A STRONG MILITARY TO PROTECT ITS INTERESTS.

KEY TRADING STATES AND THEIR ECONOMIC ROLES

AXUM

LOCATED IN PRESENT-DAY ETHIOPIA, AXUM WAS A KEY TRADING STATE CONNECTING AFRICA WITH THE ROMAN EMPIRE, INDIA, AND THE ARABIAN PENINSULA. IT WAS FAMOUS FOR ITS PORTS AND TRADING ACTIVITIES IN IVORY, GOLD, AND EXOTIC ANIMALS.

GREAT ZIMBABWE

GREAT ZIMBABWE WAS AN INFLUENTIAL TRADING CENTER IN SOUTHERN AFRICA KNOWN FOR ITS IMPRESSIVE STONE ARCHITECTURE. IT CONTROLLED TRADE ROUTES CONNECTING THE INTERIOR WITH COASTAL PORTS, DEALING IN GOLD, COPPER, AND IVORY.

KILIMANJARO AND SWAHILI CITY-STATES

- **TEXTILES AND SPICES:** IMPORTED GOODS FROM ASIA AND THE MIDDLE EAST THAT WERE TRADED WITHIN AFRICAN MARKETS.

POLITICAL AND SOCIAL STRUCTURES OF AFRICAN EMPIRES
