DEFINITION OF SOCIOLOGY

SOCIETY AND SOCIAL STRUCTURE

CULTURE AND NORMS

CULTURE ENCOMPASSES THE BELIEFS, VALUES, BEHAVIORS, AND MATERIAL OBJECTS THAT DEFINE A GROUP OF PEOPLE. NORMS ARE THE RULES AND EXPECTATIONS BY WHICH A SOCIETY GUIDES THE BEHAVIOR OF ITS MEMBERS.

- MATERIAL CULTURE: PHYSICAL OBJECTS AND ARTIFACTS
- NON-MATERIAL CULTURE: BELIEFS, LANGUAGE, VALUES, AND NORMS
- FOLKWAYS AND MORES: TYPES OF SOCIAL NORMS

MAJOR SOCIOLOGICAL THEORIES

UNDERSTANDING SOCIOLOGICAL THEORIES IS CRITICAL FOR INTERPRETING SOCIAL PHENOMENA AND ANSWERING EXAM QUESTIONS ACCURATELY. THESE THEORIES PROVIDE DIFFERENT PERSPECTIVES ON HOW SOCIETY OPERATES.

FUNCTIONALISM

FUNCTIONALISM VIEWS SOCIETY AS A COMPLEX SYSTEM WHOSE PARTS WORK TOGETHER TO PROMOTE SOLIDARITY AND STABILITY. IT EMPHASIZES THE FUNCTIONS OF SOCIAL INSTITUTIONS AND THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS TO SOCIETAL EQUILIBRIUM.

CONFLICT THEORY

SYMBOLIC INTERACTIONISM

AUGUSTE COMTE

KNOWN AS THE FATHER OF SOCIOLOGY, AUGUSTE COMTE COINED THE TERM "SOCIOLOGY" AND ADVOCATED FOR A SCIENTIFIC APPROACH TO STUDYING SOCIETY THROUGH POSITIVISM.

EMILE DURKHEIM

DURKHEIM FOCUSED ON SOCIAL FACTS AND THE ROLE OF SOCIAL INTEGRATION. HIS STUDY OF SUICIDE ESTABLISHED SOCIOLOGY AS A RIGOROUS ACADEMIC DISCIPLINE.

KARL MARX

MARX DEVELOPED CONFLICT THEORY, EMPHASIZING CLASS STRUGGLE AND ECONOMIC FACTORS AS DRIVERS OF SOCIAL CHANGE AND INEQUALITY.

MAX WEBER

WEBER INTRODUCED THE CONCEPT OF VERSTEHEN (INTERPRETIVE UNDERSTANDING) AND ANALYZED HOW CULTURE AND IDEAS INFLUENCE SOCIAL ACTION.

SOCIALIZATION AND CULTURE
