EARLY LIFE AND ENSLAVEMENT

ENSLAVED INDIVIDUALS WERE CONSIDERED PROPERTY AND WERE DENIED BASIC HUMAN RIGHTS. THE HISTORY OF MARY PRINCE REFLECTS THESE BROADER SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC STRUCTURES THAT PERPETUATED SLAVERY IN THE BRITISH COLONIES.

EXPERIENCES OF SLAVERY
