8. *NEUROMANCER* BY WILLIAM GIBSON

A SEMINAL CYBERPUNK NOVEL THAT FOLLOWS A WASHED-UP COMPUTER HACKER HIRED FOR A FINAL JOB INVOLVING ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE AND CORPORATE ESPIONAGE. IT EXPLORES THEMES OF TECHNOLOGY, CONSCIOUSNESS, AND DYSTOPIA. WHILE MORE TECHNOLOGICALLY FOCUSED, ITS SPECULATIVE VISION ALIGNS WITH THE FUTURISTIC WARNINGS IN *THE ILLUSTRATED MAN*.

9. *THE HANDMAID'S TALE* BY MARGARET ATWOOD

A DYSTOPIAN NARRATIVE SET IN A TOTALITARIAN SOCIETY WHERE WOMEN'S RIGHTS ARE SEVERELY RESTRICTED. ATWOOD EXAMINES THEMES OF POWER, CONTROL, AND RESISTANCE THROUGH THE EYES OF A HANDMAID FORCED INTO REPRODUCTIVE SERVITUDE. THE NOVEL'S CRITIQUE OF SOCIETAL STRUCTURES COMPLEMENTS THE MORAL QUESTIONS BRADBURY RAISES IN HIS STORIES.

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
