HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENT OF AMERICAN LITERATURE

COLONIAL AND EARLY AMERICAN WRITING

THE LANGUAGE WAS FORMAL, REFLECTIVE OF PURITANICAL INFLUENCES AND EUROPEAN LITERARY NORMS. WRITERS LIKE ANNE BRADSTREET AND JONATHAN EDWARDS USED ELEVATED DICTION AND MORALISTIC TONES TO COMMUNICATE THEIR MESSAGES.

19TH CENTURY EXPANSION AND NATIONAL IDENTITY

THE 19TH CENTURY SAW THE RISE OF ROMANTICISM AND TRANSCENDENTALISM, WHICH EMPHASIZED NATURE, INDIVIDUALISM, AND EMOTION. AUTHORS SUCH AS RALPH WALDO EMERSON AND HENRY DAVID THOREAU CRAFTED A LANGUAGE OF LITERATURE AMERICAN LITERATURE THAT WAS MORE EXPRESSIVE, PHILOSOPHICAL, AND DISTINCTLY AMERICAN IN OUTLOOK. MODERNISM

IN THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY, MODERNISM REVOLUTIONIZED THE LANGUAGE OF LITERATURE AMERICAN LITERATURE BY EXPERIMENTING WITH FORM, NARRATIVE TECHNIQUES, AND SYMBOLISM. WRITERS LIKE T.S. ELIOT AND F. SYMBOLISM AND IMAGERY
