THIS EXPERIMENT REMAINS A FOUNDATIONAL CASE STUDY IN UNDERSTANDING CONFORMITY, OBEDIENCE, AND THE DYNAMICS OF POWER.

DESIGN AND PROCEDURE

TWENTY-FOUR MALE COLLEGE STUDENTS WERE SELECTED AND RANDOMLY ASSIGNED TO PLAY THE ROLE OF GUARDS OR PRISONERS IN A MOCK PRISON SET UP IN THE STANFORD PSYCHOLOGY BUILDING'S BASEMENT. GUARDS WERE GIVEN UNIFORMS, WHISTLES, AND SUNGLASSES TO CREATE AN AUTHORITATIVE PRESENCE, WHILE PRISONERS WORE SMOCKS AND WERE ASSIGNED ID NUMBERS. THE ENVIRONMENT WAS DESIGNED TO MIMIC REAL PRISON CONDITIONS, INCLUDING STRICT RULES AND LIMITED PRIVACY. THE EXPERIMENT WAS ORIGINALLY PLANNED FOR TWO WEEKS BUT WAS TERMINATED AFTER SIX DAYS DUE TO THE EMERGENCE OF PSYCHOLOGICAL DISTRESS AND ABUSIVE BEHAVIORS AMONG PARTICIPANTS.

PSYCHOLOGICAL AND ETHICAL OUTCOMES

THE STANFORD PRISON EXPERIMENT REVEALED HOW QUICKLY INDIVIDUALS INTERNALIZE ROLES AND CONFORM TO EXPECTED BEHAVIORS.
