BACKGROUND OF THOMAS THISTLEWOOD

EARLY LIFE AND ARRIVAL IN JAMAICA

BEFORE ARRIVING IN JAMAICA, THOMAS THISTLEWOOD LIVED A MODEST LIFE IN ENGLAND, WORKING AS A FARM LABORER. HIS DIARY BEGINS SHORTLY AFTER HIS ARRIVAL, PROVIDING A NEAR-CONTINUOUS ACCOUNT OF HIS LIFE AND WORK OVER THE NEXT 36 YEARS.

ROLE AS AN OVERSEER AND PLANTER

AS AN OVERSEER, THISTLEWOOD WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DAY-TO-DAY MANAGEMENT OF ENSLAVED WORKERS AND PLANTATION OPERATIONS. THIS ROLE INVOLVED ENFORCING DISCIPLINE, MAXIMIZING PRODUCTIVITY, AND MAINTAINING THE ECONOMIC VIABILITY OF THE ESTATE. HIS WRITINGS DETAIL THE HARSH PUNISHMENTS INFLICTED UPON ENSLAVED INDIVIDUALS, REFLECTING THE VIOLENCE INHERENT IN THE SYSTEM. LATER, AS A LANDOWNER, THISTLEWOOD EXPANDED HIS HOLDINGS, WHICH FURTHER ENTRENCHED HIM IN THE COLONIAL SLAVE ECONOMY.

CONTENT AND STRUCTURE OF THE DIARY

THE THOMAS THISTLEWOOD DIARY IS A VOLUMINOUS COLLECTION OF DAILY ENTRIES THAT DOCUMENT AN ARRAY OF TOPICS RELATED TO PLANTATION LIFE.
