UNDERSTANDING SOCIOLOGY: DEFINITION AND SCOPE

SOCIOLOGY IS THE SYSTEMATIC STUDY OF SOCIETY, SOCIAL RELATIONSHIPS, AND SOCIAL INSTITUTIONS. IT SEEKS TO ANALYZE HOW INDIVIDUALS AND GROUPS INTERACT WITHIN A SOCIETAL CONTEXT AND HOW SOCIAL FORCES INFLUENCE BEHAVIORS AND OUTCOMES. CONFLICT THEORY

CONFLICT THEORY EMPHASIZES THE ROLE OF POWER AND INEQUALITY IN SHAPING SOCIAL RELATIONS. SOCIAL STRATIFICATION

SOCIAL STRATIFICATION REFERS TO THE HIERARCHICAL ARRANGEMENT OF INDIVIDUALS AND GROUPS IN SOCIETY BASED ON FACTORS LIKE WEALTH, POWER, AND PRESTIGE. IT EXPLAINS THE EXISTENCE OF SOCIAL CLASSES AND THE PERSISTENCE OF INEQUALITY ACROSS SOCIETIES.

CULTURE AND SOCIETY

CULTURE ENCOMPASSES THE SHARED BELIEFS, PRACTICES, LANGUAGES, AND ARTIFACTS THAT CHARACTERIZE A GROUP OR SOCIETY. IT SHAPES SOCIAL BEHAVIOR AND IDENTITY, INFLUENCING HOW INDIVIDUALS PERCEIVE AND INTERACT WITH THE WORLD AROUND THEM.
