THE ROLE OF NARRATIVE IN ILLNESS EXPERIENCE

FRANK DISCUSSES HOW PEOPLE NAVIGATE THIS PROCESS, BALANCING ACCEPTANCE AND RESISTANCE, AND HOW THIS RECONSTRUCTION OFTEN INVOLVES REDEFINING RELATIONSHIPS WITH OTHERS AND SOCIETY.

NARRATIVE APPROACH AND METHODOLOGY
